

Alerion 20 Class Annisquam Yacht Club Local Fleet Rules

Purpose: to make the Alerion 20 class raced at the Annisquam Yacht Club as one-design as possible, and to reduce the cost of ownership and racing participation.

- 1. A jib boom is required equipment.
- 2. It is permissible to raise or extend the jib tack position to compensate for different jib boom clew heights found on Alerion 20s.
- 3. The aft end of the jib boom may be held out for offwind sailing by twing lines rigged to the forestay and side stays or by a whisker pole.
- 4. It shall be permissible to add mechanical advantage which is for the purpose of reducing the strength required to make a sail trim adjustment. An example would be adding a winch or multi part block and tackle to control jib outhaul tension on the jib boom.
- 5. Center cockpit travelers and stern-mounted travelers are prohibited.
- 6. New sails shall be purchased from Sobstad (until such time as the Fleet votes for a different sailmaker) and sails shall be used for three seasons before being replaced.
- 7. No fairing or other shape changes are allowed for hull, keel or rudder. Boats with a motor well may permanently fix the removable well box and fill in and smooth the gaps between the edges of the box and the hull.
- 8. No hiking is allowed. Sitting on the side decks is permissible. For safety sitting on the foredeck is not allowed, except temporarily for making repairs or adjustment purposes.
- 9. Hand-hold devices designed to keep the middle crew member from falling overboard are permissible.
- 10. US Coast Guard approved PFDs shall be worn by all sailors while racing.
- 11. Each boat shall carry a working radio onboard while racing and monitor channel 72 for communications from the race committee.
- 12. Each boat shall carry a ladder for boarding from the water,
- 13. Each boat shall carry an anchor and rode of sufficient length to anchor in the typical racing area in Ipswich Bay.
